

Liquids: what's allowed and how should it be packed?

*) Liquids and gels are packaged in a transparent zip-top plastic bag with a maximum capacity of one litre. Only one bag per person is allowed.

What to do when you arrive at passenger security control



Place the 1-litre bag and the bag with Duty & Tax Free purchases in the tray.



Liquids that are not presented for screening in the manner specified and in accordance with regulations will be confiscated. Confiscation means that you surrender your right of ownership of these liquids and gels.

What EU regulations for liquids and gels in **IN (HAND) BAGGAGE** mean for you

As of 6 November 2006 there are new rules for all airline passengers departing from – or transferring at – an airport within the European Union (EU) regarding what may be taken on board as hand baggage. Under these rules, liquids and gels taken from home are treated differently than liquids and gels which have been purchased in a Duty & Tax Free shop. You can read more about what the EU defines as liquids and how best to pack these on page 4.

Take only essential liquids and gels in your hand baggage

If you do want to take liquids and gels on board with you, please be aware that there are certain restrictions. You can find more information about this on page 2. You will still be able to include the usual liquids and gels in your check-in baggage. Make sure to pack them carefully, to avoid breakage.

Liquids you purchase in Duty & Tax Free may be taken as hand baggage

Purchases made in one of the Duty & Tax Free shops at this airport may be taken on board the aircraft without any restriction. Shop staff will seal your purchases in a special plastic bag.

What to do with products you take **FROM HOME**

Liquids and gels are only permitted in hand baggage under the following conditions:

- Liquids and gels are in containers of 100 ml maximum
- Packaged liquids and gels are placed in a re-sealable plastic bag with a maximum volume of 1 litre
- Each individual traveller is allowed to take no more than a single plastic bag with a volume of 1 litre (these can be obtained at Amsterdam Airport Schiphol)
- Medicines and baby food that are demonstrably needed during the trip, are permitted

Important

Liquids that are not presented for screening in the manner specified and in accordance with regulations will be confiscated. Confiscation means that you surrender your right of ownership of these liquids and gels.

What to do with products purchased in the **DUTY & TAX FREE SHOPS**

Purchases made in one of the Duty & Tax Free shops at this airport are allowed in your hand baggage. These liquids and gels will be packed in the shop or on board the aircraft in a special sealed bag. Please be aware that:

- You must be able to demonstrate that the liquids were purchased on the day of the flight
- If you are making a transfer, the seal on the bag containing your Duty & Tax Free purchase may only be broken when you are on your way to your final destination

Different rules may apply for specific destinations. For more information, ask one of the Duty & Tax Free shop staff members, or go to www.schiphol.nl.

Important

Did you purchase Duty & Tax Free items in a non-EU country or on board a non-EU airline? These will be confiscated when you make a transfer at an EU airport. Confiscation means that you surrender your right of ownership of these liquids and gels.
